The joint Rural Wonca and Network: Toward Unity for Health Institute Series is being launched as part of the 17th World Rural health Conference over 4 months starting 16th October with the opening ceremony.

INTRODUCTION

We are committed to addressing the needs of the most vulnerable populations by creating communication and knowledge sharing e-learning platforms for global and national interprofessional and intersectoral communities of practice that build each participant's respective capacity.

We are guided by the values that all teach and all learn and we all learn best by doing. Using proven adult learning techniques and interactive video technology, we connect health providers with global thought leaders in regular real-time collaborative sessions. The sessions, designed around case-based learning and mutual coaching, help Global and Regional Participants gain the knowledge and skills required to improve upon existing models and services.

CONTEXT

Rural communities are heterogeneous and their needs vary community to community but they have many common issues. Therefore, while it is necessary to study rural communities through a lens that allows differentiation of needs from one location to another due to local population needs, documented disparities, age of the population, and availability of technology and human resources, there are many common themes. Factors important to consider are distances to nearest hospitals, transportation options, availability of community services, and the community's infrastructure including the quality of the roads and availability of communication, especially internet access.

In 2018 Rural Wonca under the theme 'Healing the Heart of Healthcare: Leaving No One Behind', brought together stakeholders of rural health and primary health care, to address current and future challenges in rural health. The conference culminated with the unanimous adoption of the Delhi
Declaration, calling for people living in rural and isolated parts of the to be given special priority if nations are to achieve universal health coverage. The Declaration identifies six areas as priorities to achieve "Health For All Rural People": equity and access to care, rural proofing of policy, health system development, developing and educating a workforce fit for purpose, realigning the research and people and communities.

Rural Wonca has also developed A Checklist for implementing rural pathways to train and support health workers in low and middle income countries https://ruralwonca.org/articles/health-workforce/?s=pathway. This recognizes the distinct and continuing workforce needs particular to rural areas. Rural Wonca advocates for policies that support the recruitment of family physicians to rural areas by increasing student choice of family medicine while also increasing family medicine training



programs and specifically, the support of programs preparing physicians to remain in rural areas by training in rural areas.

SERIES CONTENT

The joint Rural Wonca and Network: Toward Unity for Health Institute Series discusses the delivery of care in rural areas in a sustainable manner and how rural health care may change in the future ensuring that it is accessible, high quality, and economically value-based.

The 17th World Rural health Conference held over 4 months starts with an opening ceremony the 16th October followed by the Bangladesh virtual fora on 17th and 18th October.
